

Human Trafficking in Houston

Human trafficking is a modern-day form of slavery that doesn't discriminate on ethnicity, gender or age. Victims of human trafficking are subjected to force, fraud and coercion for the purpose of sexual exploitation and/or forced labor.









After drug dealing, human trafficking has surpassed the illegal arms industry as the second largest and fastest growing criminal industry in the world.

The Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (TVPA) defines "Severe Forms of Trafficking in Persons" as:


- **SEX TRAFFICKING:** The recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision or obtaining of a commercial sex act that is induced by force, fraud or coercion; or when the person forced to perform such an act is under the age of 18 years; or
- **LABOR TRAFFICKING:** The recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud or coercion for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage or slavery.

DEMOGRAPHICS

83,000 Victims Trafficked in Texas

20.000 Victims **Trafficked** in Houston





The number of victims identified globally (44,758)reflects only 0.2% of the victims.2

Commercial sex includes forced prostitution, stripping and pornography. Trafficking also takes place as labor exploitation, including domestic servitude (maids/nannies), sweatshop factories, traveling sales crews or migrant agricultural work.

Has your identification or documentation been taken from you?




What type of work do you do? Are you being paid?
